California State Legislations



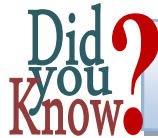
AB1379 Effective January 1, 2018 Disability Access mandated fee is now \$4.00.

SB182 Effective June 1, 2018 Transportation Network Drivers are required to obtain a business license in the city the driver resides.

New AB939 Effective January 1, 2019 Taxicab operators to obtain a business license in the city the driver or business is located in.

New AB2184 Effective January 1, 2019 California issued photo identification accepted in lieu of a social security #.

New AB3002 Effective January 1, 2019 Requires cities to provide informational notice of disability access requirements to applicants for business license & commercial building permits.



Licenses are valid by location, owner, & business type.

Online Green Services

The City of Murrieta Business License offers convenient services online.



- ▽ Option to go paperless.
- ▽ Submit a **Change of Address Request**. *NEW*
- ▽ **Receive Renewal Notice** by email 2 months prior to your expiration date.
- ▽ Submit a new **Business License Application** online.
- ▽ **Pay** outstanding fees/balances.
- ▽ **Renew** your license online & **Pay**; license account # and PIN # are required and can be found in the renewal email and paper notices.
- ▽ **Online Features Available 24/7:** Apply, Renew, Pay, Update, Closeout, Inactivate.
- ▽ **Secure Online Payments** accepted: Visa, Mastercard, Discover, & echeck.
- ▽ When renewing or submitting an application online, you may add **Comments** you would like us to view.
- ▽ **Online Renewal** is available up to a maximum of 350 days after the license expiration date.
- ▽ **Attach Required Documents** upon renewing and submitting the application online.
- ▽ **CLOSEOUT** your **Business License** online.

Common Q&A's:

Q: What do I do if my Business Ownership OR Ownership Type changed?

A: 1.) Closeout the current license account. 2.) A new application is required for all changes in Ownership or Ownership Type.

Q: How do I update my business address?

A: You can now submit an online Change of Address Request by visiting our webpage and clicking on the change of address request icon.

Q: Why is my gross income required for my business license renewal?

A: License fees are based on annual gross income, except flat rates. If you provide zero gross income and are not a flat rate, we will contact you to verify. If your business continuously produces zero gross (warehouse, etc.), we may ask for more information to validate.

Q: Why is there a previous balance on my account?

A: This may be due to previous year license fees, penalties (late fees), miscalculation of fees, etc.

ABOUT YOUR MURRIETA BUSINESS LICENSE

- *The expiration date is printed on your license certificate.
- *License is valid for 1 year and is non-transferable.
- *License is valid for 1 location; additional locations require an additional license.
- *License to be posted in a conspicuous place.
- *Local Businesses are required to keep the license current.
- *Outside Businesses may make the license Inactive if no longer conducting business in our city and reactivate when returning to conduct business.
- *It is the business owner's responsibility to renew the license before the expiration date.
- *License penalties accrue the following month after the expiration date.
- *License remains Active and Open until you CLOSE IT.
- *Keep your business information updated; business address name, phone number, email, etc.
- *Emailed renewal notices are sent 2 months prior to the expiration date and paper renewals are mailed 1 month prior.

Mandatory Recycling

Businesses and Multi-Family Properties Must Recycle Their Organic Waste

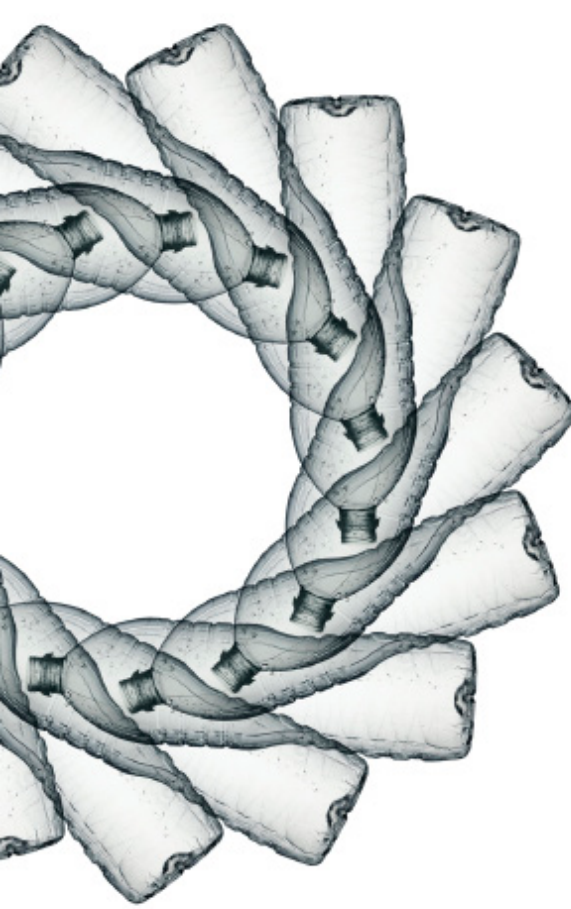


In April 2016, AB 1826 California's Mandatory Organic Waste Recycling Law, required businesses and multi-family properties that generate 8 cubic yards of organic* waste to arrange for organic waste recycling services. **Effective January 2017, this requirement extends to businesses and multi-family properties that generate 4 cubic yards of organic waste.**

*Organic waste includes food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed with food waste.

Overview of AB 1826 Requirements

Date	Cubic Yards Generated Weekly
April 1, 2016	8 (organic waste)
January 1, 2017	4 (organic waste)
January 1, 2019	4 (commercial solid waste)



Businesses and Multi-Family Properties Must Recycle

In July 2012, AB 341 California's Mandatory Commercial Recycling law, went into effect, requiring businesses that generate at least four cubic yards of waste per week, as well as multi-family complexes with five units or more, regardless of the amount of waste generated, to recycle.
