

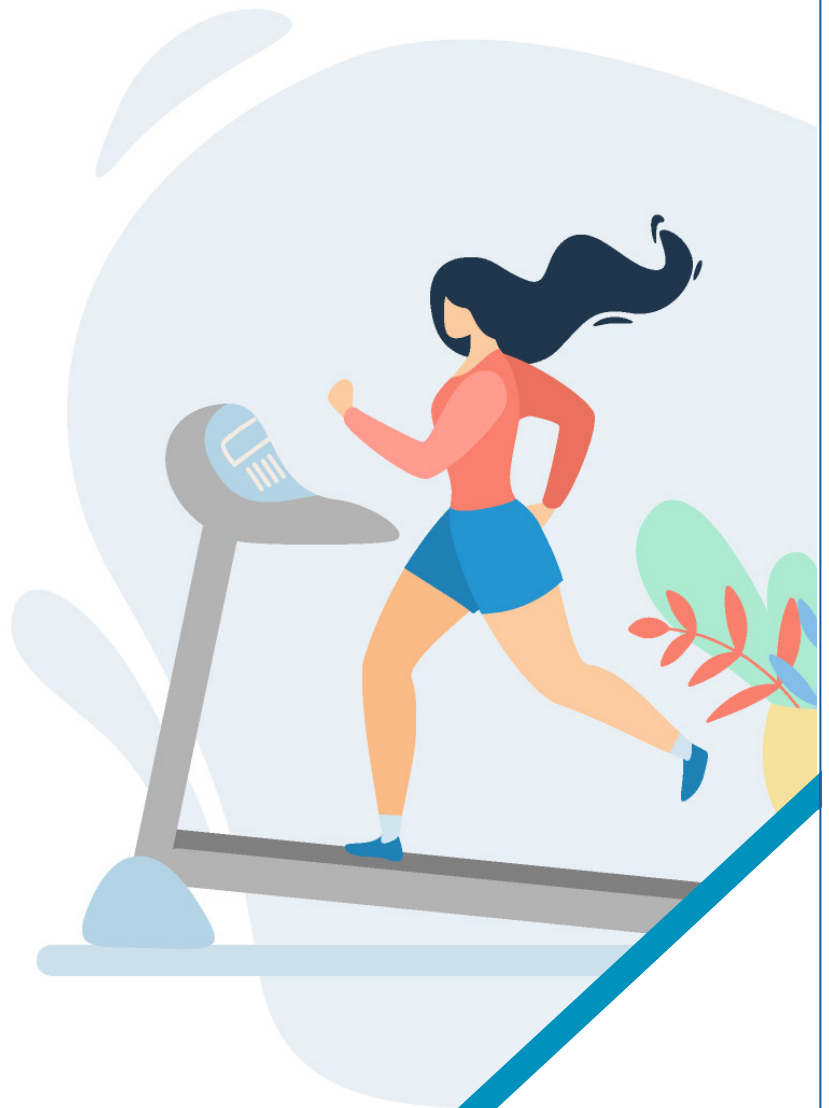
Fitness Facilities Move Outdoors

The City of Murrieta is helping local fitness facilities transition to modified outdoor operations, as allowed by the State of California's Public Health order.

Recent temporary changes in City parking regulations will allow for services to take place in a businesses' private parking spaces.

You will find more specifics on the back. We want to make this easy, and are not imposing City fees or permits for temporary outdoor fitness center operations.

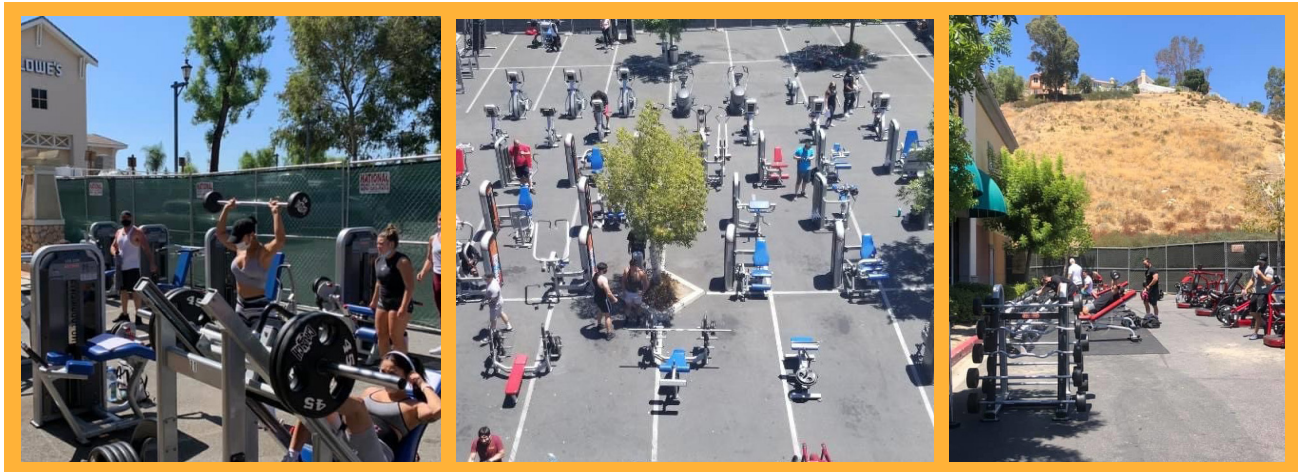

City of Murrieta Outdoor Fitness Center Guidelines

Please also read and follow all [State of California Checklist for Fitness Facilities and adjust to outdoor operations where applicable.](#)

- Make sure to get approval from property manager.
- Fitness centers may use private parking spaces, adjacent to the building, but must maintain ADA spaces.
- Fitness activities and classes must be held in an area that is clearly marked and out of the path of travel.
- The business may operate under a tent, canopy, or other sun shelter as long as no more than one side is closed, allowing sufficient outdoor air movement.
- It is advisable to use reflectors or lighting to highlight barriers or fencing.
- Implement measures to physically separate gym members by at least six feet from each other by using measures such as equipment spacing, physical partitions or markings.
- Do not block fire lanes, ADA access or exit routes.
- Make sure all cords are secure, and do not present fire or tripping hazards.
- Do not allow customers to enter the building for any reason.
- The State also requires that face coverings must be worn when interacting in-person with members of the public (indoors or outdoors).
- Any equipment brought outside must be kept inside a fenced area and locked at night.
- Business takes all responsibility for outside equipment.
